## SDP 2 – Lifelong Effective Word Learners

This year we are introducing 'Word Aware' - our chosen whole school approach to teaching vocabulary – into our Nursery to support vocabulary development from the moment children begin their learning journey here at Merry Hill. Last term, our youngest learners really enjoyed meeting concept cat who teaches them all about concepts such as big, small, first, same and different.

## Word Detectives

We will continue using the Word Aware approach in Reception and KS1 but will extend our children by introducing the Independent Word Learners phase.

- ❖ We want our children to show an interest in words – both spoken and written.
- ❖ We want them to recognise when they don't understand a word and be curious about its meaning.
- ❖ We want the children to be proud when they learn a new word and share it with others.

There are so many words in our language that we simply cannot teach them all so our children will become word detectives, using taught strategies to uncover the meaning of unknown words.

**Date for the diary – 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2024 – Vocabulary Parade – come to school wearing a costume, picture or hat to illustrate a word you are proud to know!**

This year's focus will celebrate our uniqueness by coming to school showing a word we are proud to know. This could be linked to a special interest or sport the children take part in, it may be a word in your home language or it may be a very long word that the children are proud to know.
