Visitors observed our Year 2 (Swans) class in action and saw how our children approach mathematics with curiosity, confidence, and enthusiasm. ### **Growing Together: Our School's Green Transformation**

In May last year, we had the pleasure of meeting Mr Anstey, a passionate volunteer from the Woodland Trust and a former headteacher, who kindly offered his time and expertise to help us enhance our school's wildlife area.

With his support, we successfully applied for a Woodland Trust tree pack and were thrilled to receive over 150 young saplings, trees, and bushes delivered to our school last Friday.

This week, our pupils have enthusiastically taken part, with Mr Johnson, in planting these new trees and bushes across our grounds. It has been a wonderful, hands-on learning experience, encouraging them to take pride in caring for the environment and to understand how small actions can make a big difference.

By expanding our wildlife area, we are not only improving biodiversity and creating natural habitats for birds and insects, but also building a living, outdoor classroom that promotes wellbeing, environmental awareness, and a love of nature.

This project is part of our ongoing commitment to sustainability, ensuring that our school continues to grow as a place where both children and the natural world can thrive.
