This week we celebrated British Science Week and the theme was 'Time'. Time is key to so many discoveries in Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. At school our little scientists are hard at work making observations and asking questions about the world. Our Nursery children had first-hand experience of lifecycles with the hatching of the chicks, which taught them to look closely and observe change over time. Our KS1 children have also been looking at change over time by learning about seasons and observing plants. Our Year 1 children visited Bushey Rose Gardens this week as part of this seasonal change learning and were able to spot signs of spring such as flowers growing, blossom budding and butterflies and bees returning.
