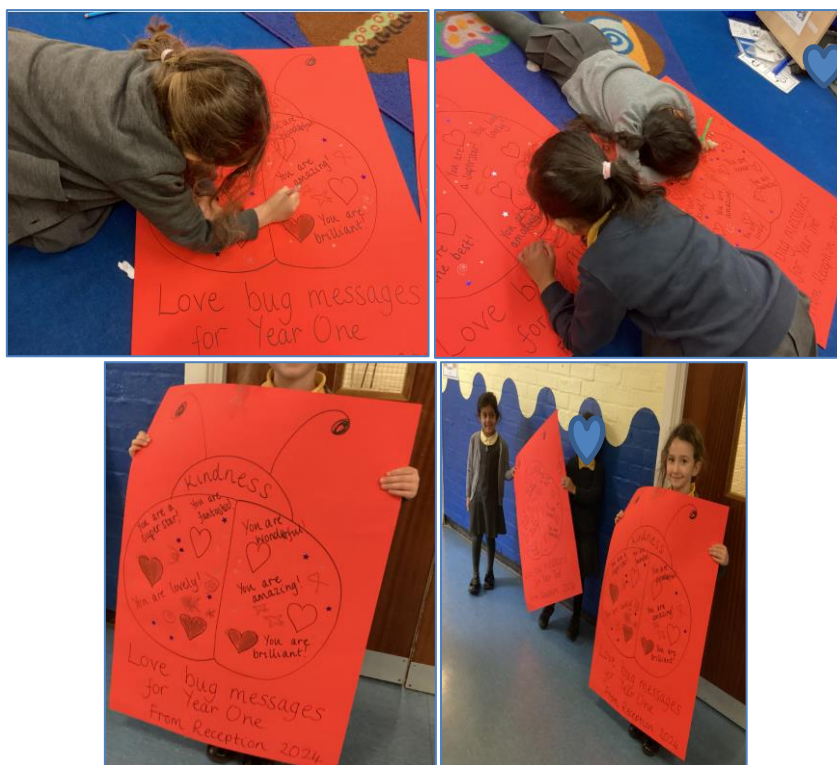
What's been happening at Merry Hill this week?
