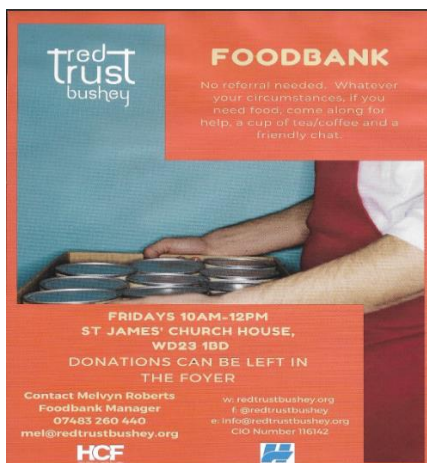
What does Merry Hill offer for families needing financial support?

You may remember that back in June, I wrote to you about our Herts County Council commissioned visit which reviewed the effectiveness of our school's actions to reduce the impact of economic exclusion on pupils. This week we had a very successful review visit from County; we will share the report findings shortly.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you of the information sent in June so that you can access support if and when it is required. Below is a list of what we already offer and we are in the process of creating a website page which will show all this information.

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- **Pre-loved uniform** sales
- **Unbranded uniform** is perfectly acceptable and readily available from supermarkets
- Melissa Adams (Headteacher) is our **point of contact** for families requiring financial support (my door is always open, so please come and see me if you would like to talk)
- Financial support is available for **school trips** should this be required
- **After school clubs** – we want as many children to attend as possible and can offer financial support if needed / some funded places
