They are showing us that they are not only **ready** for learning but also eager to do their very best. It is wonderful to see their enthusiasm shining through in classrooms and around the school, this is a real credit to their hard work and the support you give at home.

😊 A Happy Face

At Merry Hill, we believe that children learn best when they feel happy, safe and respected. That is why our behaviour curriculum, *The Merry Hill Way*, is central to everything we do.

This Autumn, our focus is on instilling the *core rules*: **Ready, Respectful, Safe**. They underpin all of our behaviour expectations and are carefully taught through assemblies, PSHE lessons and daily routines.

This week we have focused on the rule Respectful:

- EYFS We follow adult direction
- **KS1** We act on adult instructions immediately

By practising these expectations in age-appropriate ways, the children are learning the importance of listening carefully. In EYFS, it has been lovely to see our youngest learners following adult direction with growing independence, while in KS1, children are showing maturity by responding promptly to instructions. These small steps are helping to build calm, respectful classrooms where every child can thrive.

A Learning Place

On Wednesday, our School Effectiveness Advisor visited Merry Hill to observe phonics and reading teaching across the school. She watched phonics lessons, interventions, and children reading to familiar adults to feedback on this fundamental element of our curriculum.

We are very proud to share that she was extremely impressed with the consistent implementation of our chosen phonics scheme; Essential Letters and Sounds. Phonics is such a vital part of the curriculum, laying the foundation for future learning, and we are delighted with how confidently and effectively it is embedded at Merry Hill.

As we are now in the fourth year of implementation, we have also arranged for an ELS trainer to visit in November. This will ensure that our excellent practice continues and that staff receive ongoing professional development to maintain our high standards.
