### **Roofing Works Update**

As per our previous communication, I would like to inform you that we will be commencing roofing works during half-term. This initial stage of the work will be the installation of scaffolding along the newer part of the school building. In addition, there will be a skip and a storage unit set up alongside the entrance to the school.

We would like to assure you that this work has been carefully planned with county and the building contractors to minimize any impact on our daily school routine. The safety and uninterrupted learning experience of our pupils remain top priorities.

What we should expect:

The roofing works, including the scaffolding, skip and storage unit, are strategically placed to ensure minimal disruption to the access into and from the school.

We want to again emphasize that the ongoing works will not interfere with the learning process. Classes will proceed as normal, and our dedicated teaching staff will ensure that children's experience remains undisturbed. We do anticipate that the work carried out, these construction activities, may spark your child's curiosity about the career of being a construction worker. Our staff are prepared to answer their questions and incorporate this real-life experience into their learning.

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We would ask that you discuss this exciting development with your child/ren and let them know that it is a part of maintaining and improving our school. This opportunity to observe the roofing works (from ground level of course) is a fabulous experience, showcasing how a school can undergo improvements just like our own homes.

#### **Harvest Assembly**

On Wednesday afternoon, we welcomed Father Andrew Burton from St. Peter's Church who led an assembly about Harvest Festival. Father Andrew shared a wonderful story about Babbity Bee, who visited lots of different flowers, sucking the nectar to make honey and collecting the pollen too. The children loved listening and particularly enjoyed telling our special visitor which colour flower Babbity was visiting and counting how many flowers she had been to! The story showed the children how important even the tiniest little insects can be because, not only do bees create delicious honey, they also help the flowers to reproduce and grow. Father Andrew and Sharon Fowler, who came from the Red Trust Bushey, were really impressed by our HUGE Harvest collection of cans and dry foods. Sharon took all the food back to the Red Trust Food Bank straight afterwards. All the food that Merry Hill families have generously donated is so needed, especially in the current cost-of-living crisis, and Sharon assured us that our collection will be greatly appreciated by all the people who use the Red Trust Bushey Foodbank and Café. Thank you, Father Andrew, for coming in and leading such an engaging assembly. 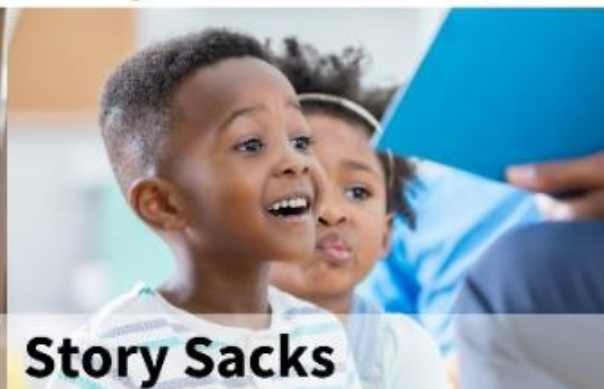

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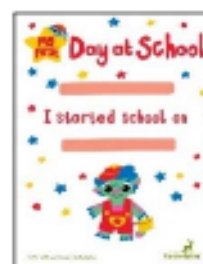
