E-Safety

As we enter the new school year, many of us enjoy sharing photos of our children on social media platforms. However, it is essential to prioritise their safety when doing so. If you do post online, then try following these simple rules to help keep everyone safe:

- Avoid posting photos showing the *school logo/name* or *recognisable places* that could disclose your location
- Never include your *child's full name* in captions or comments
- Consider whether there are other children in the pictures you are sharing, do you have *permission* from their parent/carer to upload it?
- Consider whether your child is happy for you to upload the photo of them/comment about them? (What might seem 'cute' now could be embarrassing for them in the future)
- Ensure that your privacy setting on social media are appropriately configured

Alternatively, you can choose to share photos directly with individuals, like grandparents, friends etc. through private messaging platforms like WhatsApp or I Message etc. rather than on public social media profiles. This way, you can maintain a higher level of control over who sees the images.



Paryushana – Jain festival of forgiveness

On Wednesday, we were delighted to welcome Jignasha, a representative from Shrimad Rajchandra Mission Dharampur, the Jain organisation in Bushey. Jignasha joined our KS1 classes for their Wednesday *Celebrations, Diversity and Around the World Assembly*. The children learnt about the Jain religion and how it was created over 2600 years ago in ancient India by Lord Mahavira. Jignasha focussed on the 8-day period of Paryushana, which is a Jain festival of forgiveness. The children learnt Jains believe forgiving is a great way to lighten your heart by letting go of wrongdoings and making a happy heart once more. Jignasha ended her assembly with a meditation that focussed on deep breathing and forgiveness. It was a lovely and calm way to end her visit.
