Merry Hill's Vocabulary Parade

We look forward to holding our Vocabulary Parade at Merry Hill on Friday 2nd February. The children will come to school as a word they are **proud to know** and through the variety of words we will celebrate individuality and uniqueness. The chosen word could be linked to a special interest or sport the children take part in, it may be a word in your home language or it may be a very long word that the children are proud to know.

It can be any type of word e.g. noun (karate), adjective (glamorous) or verb (sprinting)

Two Rules:

- Show the word you have selected in a costume form
- Write the word and definition somewhere on the costume

The children can wear a costume, attach a picture/drawing of their chosen word, turn a hat into a vocabulary parade costume or decorate a t-shirt. If your child is not wearing a full costume, they can come to school in their school uniform but with the addition of their vocabulary parade accessory. We look forward to celebrating the children's words next Friday!

'Healthy Learners' – how we ensure we are ready to learn

Task

The Golden Hoop

Equipment:

- Basketball hoop
- Basket balls
- Cones

What to do:

This is a shooting game.

- Place the cones 5 steps apart.
- Each cone represents a different level.
- The further away the cone, the harder to level.
- The aim of the game is to score from each level.
- Children take turns to throw the basket ball into the hoop.

Football

Equipment:

- Football
- Tall cones
- Hoop

What to do:

This is a ball skill game.

- Place 5 hoops around the field.
- Place a numbered cone inside (from 1 to 5). These will be the 5 holes.
- Each hole needs a starting cone.
- Children kick the ball to the cone and count how many kicks it takes.
