#### **Purim Festival**

On Monday Rabbi Lister visited from Bushey United Synagogue and led an assembly about the festival of Purim. On Purim the Jewish community celebrate the bravery of Queen Esther, a very smart Jewish woman who was married to King Achashverosh. When Esther learned that Haman, who worked for the King, was plotting against the Jews, she summoned the courage to tell the King about Haman's evil plan and saved her people. Rabbi Lister showed the children the story of Purim written in a scroll in Hebrew. He led the assembly dressed up as Batman, because Jewish people often like to dress up during this festival.
