Parent Consultations and Attendance

During Parent Consultations this week, families were provided with:

- A flyer advertising the **Mastering Number at Home workshops**, starting next week for **Reception, Year 1 and Year 2**
- Your child's **attendance sheet** (for all year groups)

As a reminder, attendance is categorised as follows:

- **Above 95%** – Good attendance
- **90–94.9%** – At risk of becoming a persistent absentee
- **Below 90%** – Persistent absentee (as defined by the DfE)

Good attendance is vital for children's **academic progress, wellbeing and social development**. Being in school every day helps children build secure friendships, develop confidence and emotional resilience, and fully access learning opportunities. Even small amounts of missed time can have a significant impact over the year.

'Little Vets' Assembly

This week, the children enjoyed a special assembly delivered by Little Vets, where members of a real veterinary team shared what a day in the life of a vet or vet nurse looks like.

The assembly was thoroughly enjoyed by the children with highlights including:

- Fun facts about pet care and the work vets do
- Real X-ray pictures with a *guess the animal* game
- True clinic case stories
- An exciting hands-on activity where children were able to bandage a toy dog's paws and try real equipment such as a stethoscope and ophthalmoscope

The aim of Little Vets is to inspire the next generation of vets, and it certainly achieved its aim! The children were captivated throughout.
