### Mastering Number at Home Workshops

This week we welcomed Reception and Year 1 parents into school to take part in our *Mastering Number at Home* workshops.

Parents were first given information by our in-house maths specialist, Mrs Ineson, before being invited into the classroom to practise the games alongside their children. These sessions highlighted the importance of strong foundations in maths and how learning through play supports children's understanding and confidence.

All children took home a maths resource pack on the day of their workshop. If you were unable to attend, a resource pack has been placed in your child's book bag, and a recording of the workshop is now live on the school website.

Thank you to all parents who attended this week — we are very fortunate to have such a strong parent partnership. Please remember to practise the games regularly at home.
