Communication at Merry Hill

Collaborating with our learning community is fundamental to the achievement of our learners. The intention behind each mode of communication is outlined as follows:

Merry Hill Matters (Friday) - this weekly newsletter will keep you up to date with school information categorized according to our curriculum drivers. It enables you to share in our school vision and values and learn more about our school priorities. This will be sent out every Friday.

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Dates and Reminders – Along with Merry Hill Matters, on a Friday, you will receive upcoming dates and key reminders

Emails (Tuesday and Friday) – These messages serve as a means to convey relevant and time-sensitive updates.

Blogs – These weekly blogs share the children’s learning from the week to give you an insight into what’s happening in the classroom and provide further guidance on how you can support learning at home. These will also be ready for you on a Friday.

Seesaw – This online platform is used in KS1 and shares learning, homework and reading progress. It is a two way communication of your child’s learning journey.

Tapestry – This online platform is used to share the learning within school across the Early Years and enables our parents/carers to respond and also share home learning and events.

Curriculum Drivers

At Merry Hill, we have developed a broad curriculum driven by the learning elements our children require to be successful life-long learners.

Our curriculum’s distinctiveness lies in the foundation of our four key drivers: **Healthy Learners, Curious Learners, Ambitious Learners and Collaborative Learners.**

The newsletter is structured around these four drivers, serving as a means to emphasise these fundamental components of our curriculum. Our drivers are what make our Merry Hill curriculum unique.

‘Healthy Learners’ – *how we ensure we are ready to learn*

Our youngest learners have embarked on their Merry Hill learning journey and are settling in beautifully. Phonics


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At Merry Hill, we use the ELS (Essentials Letters and Sounds) programme to teach phonics. Reading

The children in KS1 will be bringing home their first reading books of the year. These include 2 books:

- 1 colour spot book for shared reading with an adult
- 1 phonics book, which is a fully decodable text, which the children should be able to read independently. The children will use their phonic skills to help them read unfamiliar words. The phonics decodable book has a label in the top right hand corner with the focus phonemes within the text.



Please spend some time this week practising reading with your child. There will be more information coming out to you regarding reading books. These texts will be changed every Friday in school. We encourage you to read each decodable text 4 times focussing on a different reading skill each time. Please watch this video to guide you through each of the 4 skills:

Attendance

According to the law, EVERY CHILD of compulsory school age is entitled to receive a suitable, full-time education that aligns with their age, capabilities and any special educational requirements they may have. It is the legal duty of every parent to ensure their child receives this education either by attending a school or through alternative educational arrangements.


This week Professor Chris Whitty, the Chief Medical Officer, alongside other health professionals, wrote to schools to provide a public health perspective on illness and school attendance. The letter says that it is usually appropriate for pupils to attend school with mild respiratory illnesses, including general cold symptoms. Improving attendance is a collective responsibility. We want to work with you to ensure your child's attendance is the best it can be. We will ensure Merry Hill is a calm, orderly, safe, and supportive environment where your children want to be and are keen and ready to learn.

As a school we ask that you phone or email on the first day of your child's absence – preferably before the start of the day – to inform us why your child is not in school. We analyse data

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to ensure any dips in attendance are acted upon immediately so that we can work together to keep attendance high. If you need support to improve your child's attendance, please be assured that we will happily work alongside you to remove any barriers and support you and your child.
