You could make your own super long super worm using old tights and stuffing them. Turn them into puppets and use them to retell the story. Can you make different lengths and measure them?

## Make some 'edible' dirt!

### What you'll need

- 1 x cup Icing sugar
- Water
- 3 tablespoons cocoa powder
- Flour

### Method

- Pour icing sugar and cocoa into a bowl
- Add water until a thick consistency
- Stir in a little flour at a time until dough like consistency
- Knead into a soft dough
- Options for play
  - Keep as soft dough (store in fridge in cling wrap)
  - Add water to make thick runny 'mud'
  - Separate dough into small chunks and leave overnight to dry out and make edible dirt. Just rub dried out dough chunks between your hands to get dirt like consistency.

OR

Use a packet of Angel Delight following those directions, mix some broken cookies into it (chocolate preferably) and decorate with gummy worms.
